Much of my current work focuses on the bioenergy, rural development, and forestry. In past years I have worked on issues of aquaculture, marine fisheries and coastal resource management, hazardous waste management, and environmental justice. Much of my work is interdisciplinary in nature. Distilled into a single word, my interest is on questions of power, how it is established, maintained, and challenged.
